

Honor Ceremonialist Award - Youth

The Honor Ceremonialist Award is intended to honor those Ceremonialists who have served well as a Ceremonialist and have shown extraordinary service as a Ceremonialist. This is intended to serve as a small token of the Egwa Tawa Dee Lodge's gratitude toward our Ceremonialists, as they are incredibly important to the Order since they are one of the first things a candidate sees when entering our Order. This award can only be earned once per person in their lifetime. To be eligible for this award the following standards must be met within a 24-month period after January 1st 2015:

1. Perform 5 ceremonies, with at least one of them being from each level you have attained. If the ceremonialist is an Ordeal member, then they must do 5 combined ceremonies between Pre-Ordeal and Ordeal. If he is a Brotherhood or Vigil Honor member, then they must do 5 combined ceremonies between Pre - Ordeal, Ordeal and Brotherhood.*
2. Be evaluated for each ceremony you are able to perform at your current membership level at Spring Pow-Wow or its equivalent: Conclave or NOAC**
3. Participate in 20 hours of ceremony practice - signed off by your Chapter Chief and Chapter Adviser.

Each Ceremonialist is responsible for their own progress on their record sheet. Once completed, it must be signed by the Lodge Vice-Chief of Inductions.

* If you are a Vigil Honor Member, a Vigil Ceremony will count towards this award, but a Vigil Ceremony is not required as the opportunities to perform the ceremony are limited.

** If you are unable to attend these events, your evaluation requirement can be met by being evaluated by the Vice-Chief of Inductions and/or the Ceremonies Chairman. You must submit a written request at least two weeks in advance of the date in which you wish to be evaluated, and the VCI and Ceremonies Chair reserve the right to deny any of these requests.
