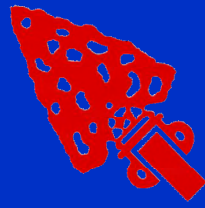

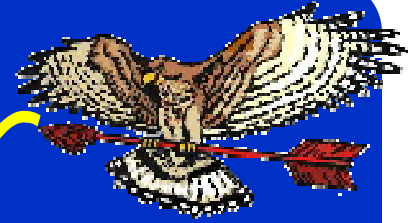

*E. Urner Goodman and Carroll A. Edson, directors of Treasure Island Scout Camp, founded the Order of the Arrow in the summer of 1915. The Order became an approved part of the Boy Scout program in 1934, and is used today by all but one council.*

## Got Brotherhood?



Dear Brothers, Going through the Ordeal makes you a member of the honor society of scouting, but it is just the first step to becoming a truly outstanding scout. 10 months after your Ordeal, you are eligible to go through Brotherhood and "seal" your membership within the lodge. Why do this? What is the difference between a naked sash and a barred sash?

Going through Brotherhood serves many purposes. It states that you wish to serve others. Your troop elects you to go through the Ordeal, but you decide to go through the Brotherhood. Going through Brotherhood tells your troop that they made the right decision by electing you to the order. In many troops, going through Brotherhood is even announced at Court-of-Honors. I urge you, as a Brother and a friend, take the second step of the journey, seal your membership and become an active member in the lodge.

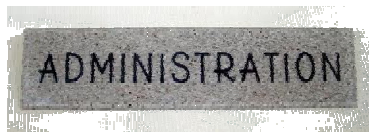
morning before breakfast. If you are interested, please contact me at [vcprogram@aaacegwa.org](mailto:vcprogram@aaacegwa.org).

### Vice-Chief of Administration

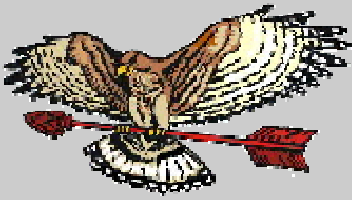

make sure that you get all merchandise ideas and patch designs to me so that I can look them over and hopefully get them added to the trading post for this next year.

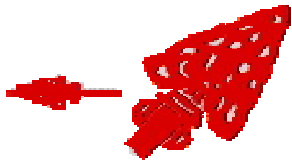

The National OA SummitCorps fee is \$250.00 (+ our Egwa transportation costs) for the week. The current estimation for Egwa transportation is \$100 or less.

The National fee includes seven days of program, 18 meals, safety equipment, insurance coverage, recognition items, and a full day of recreational fun. SummitCorps participants and staff will be required to bring a completed and signed Annual BSA Health and Medical Record form to attend.

The Order of the Arrow and the New River Gorge National River have joined together to create a program titled SummitCorps – The New River Experience. A chance for 2,000 Arrowmen from all over the USA to provide meaningful service during a four-week period in July 2011. Each week 500 Arrowmen will attend to provide service building a new bike and hiking trail on National River land adjacent to the Boy Scouts of America's newest high adventure base and future site of National Scout Jamborees: *The Summit: Bechtel Family National Scout Reserve* in West Virginia. SummitCorps will provide a unique opportunity for youth and adult Arrowmen to set an example of leadership in service to those who treasure our National Parks. In addition, we will live an experience that will leave Arrowmen with:

- A deeper understanding of the Scout Oath, Scout Law, Order of the Arrow Obligation, and what it means to “live” these words in one’s daily life.
- A renewed spirit, pride, and enthusiasm for Scouting and the Order of the Arrow.
- Skills that will help them to be more effective leaders in their lodge, Scout units and communities.
- New program ideas, knowledge, and skills that will help them to be of greater service back in their home unit, lodge and council.
- A deeper appreciation of our country’s natural resources.
- New friendships with fellow Arrowmen from throughout the United States and memories to last a lifetime

The 2011 SummitCorps program will cover a four-week period of time from July 3 through the 30th. Egwa’s week is the second one, July 10 – 16, 2011. The staging area for this program will be the Glen Jean, West Virginia National Guard Armory (on US Highway 19). Glen Jean is also where the headquarters for the New River Gorge National River is located. **All participants must register as a member of their local lodge contingent or be a member of the SummitCorps staff. Staff applications will be on line. Lodge contingents may sign up for one week ONLY on a first come, first serve basis.**

For the 2011 SummitCorps program, each Lodge will be allotted **only 8** participants in the first sign-up. All Lodges will have until December 1, 2010 to use their allotted number of reservations. Reservations not used will be released to other lodges on a first come, first serve basis. **Lodges may apply for no more than 15 additional spaces when they send in their original reservation, which will be placed on a first come, first serve waiting list, which means, if you want to attend, sign up NOW.** Although there are no ratios imposed on youth to adult participation, youth will be given preference if they sign up first.

To sign-up, using the form below, mail your deposit check for \$100 per participant to the Atlanta Area Council, BSA **ASAP**, but no later than **November 10, 2010**. The \$100 per-person deposit is transferable to a substitute within the same lodge on a one for one basis, but it is non-refundable, and may not be applied to the balance due for another person. Participants canceling their reservation after May 31, 2011 will forfeit their entire SummitCorps fee. (Lodges requesting additional space beyond their quota of only 8 persons must submit a \$100 deposit to hold those extra spaces, which is refundable if the requested space is not filled.) No individual reservations will be accepted. All weeks will be filled on a *first come, first serve basis*, so lodges are encouraged to register and send in their deposits **early**. **There are only 500 spaces per week available, including staff.**

**Housing:** SummitCorps participants and staff members will be camping on the Glen Jean National Guard Armory grounds and will need to bring their own tent and sleeping gear. Once registered, participants will be sent a list of necessary personal items to bring.

In 2011, the SummitCorps website will provide information about programs that will be offered at the project site. This will include information about recreational opportunities, special events, religious services, opening and closing gatherings, and special guests. The National OA SummitCorps fee is \$250.00 (+ our Egwa transportation costs) for the week. The National fee includes seven days of program, 18 meals, safety equipment, insurance coverage, recognition items, and a full day of recreational fun. We will keep our transportation costs as low as possible; we are estimating \$100 or less for traveling costs.

All SummitCorps participants are required to provide a completed and signed annual BSA Health and Medical Record form. Examination must take place no more than twelve months prior to the start of the week. All participants must meet the Philmont height and weight guidelines and be in good physical condition to participate in the SummitCorps 2011.
