## LLD and Winter Banquet Are Coming Up Fast!

### Writing A New Set Of Rules

The newly elected officers of the Egwa Tawa Dee Lodge didn't waste any time putting their new ideas into action. At the LEC following Fall Fellowship, only one day after he had been voted in, the new Lodge Chief, Ben Milner, stood up and announced the formation of a new committee with a very special purpose: the rewriting of the Lodge Bylaws. The Bylaws act as the Constitution of the Lodge; they outline the powers, responsibilities, and organization of the Lodge and its officers, chapters, and individual members. The officers felt that it was time for the formation of a new, revised set of rules for the Lodge. The new committee was made up of a single youth representative from each of the 16 chapters of the Lodge and was chaired and overseen by our VC of Administration, Christian Goerner. The committee met several times, each time getting closer to having a new governing document for our Lodge. Christian commented that this whole process "has shown that our Lodge when faced with a problem can act to fix it." The committee is done with the writing of the new "Lodge Rules" and the vote for ratification will take place on December 7th.



### Save the Date: Conclave 2014

This past April, Egwa hosted the largest conclave in Section history. Over 1000 arrowmen from Georgia and Alabama came to enjoy a weekend of competition,

learning, and fellowship at Bert Adams Scout Reservation. In 2014, Aracoma Lodge, located in the western part of Alabama, will be hosting Conclave on one of the most beautiful sites that it has ever been on. The Conclave will take place April 25th –27th at the Moundville Archaeological Park in Moundville, Alabama. But this is no ordinary park. The park is located on the site of one of the largest and most complex ancient areas of Mississippian (Native American) culture. What better place to hold an Order of the Arrow Conclave? Aracoma is working diligently to prepare for another great section Conclave.

## OA High Adventure Opportunities

The Order of the Arrow offers arrowmen a unique opportunity: the chance to spend a couple weeks doing service in one of BSA's four National High Adventure bases. The National OA has five different programs that allow you to experience all that Boy Scouts has to offer. You could maintain backpacking trails at Philmont Scout Ranch, build portage trails at Northern Tier, do underwater conservation projects at Sea Base, or maintain trails around the new Summit Bechtel Reserve. The first half of each program is service, and then the second half is a full trek at the High Adventure base. Each program costs only a fraction of what it would cost to go to a High Adventure Base with your troop and is almost twice as long as a normal troop High Adventure experience. Don't miss out on a fantastic opportunity to join in Fellowship and Cheerful Service with arrowmen from across the nation at some of the most stunning locations imaginable.
